The GTT students have been busy this term installing QR code signs by the plants so that visiting classes can scan the QR code and it will them some interesting facts about the plant.

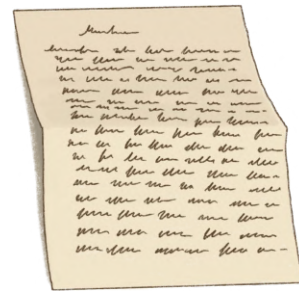
