STUDENT SUCCESS - PIANO



All incomes received from the concert will be donated to local charity to support Ukraine children and refugee.

Shan then won 1st Prize at the International Piano Competition for Young Musicians, in Enschede, The Netherlands. The prize was awarded by the Enschede Mayor, and in addition to this he was awarded another 2 special prizes: 'Best Performance Prize' & 'Audience Prize', which has made Shan the youngest ever 1st Prize Winner & winner of the most prizes in the competition history.
