It was facilitated by Wahine Toa, and the girls learnt basic physical techniques; how to reinforce assertiveness, boundary-setting skills and verbal techniques; as well as age-appropriate games and information. The girls enjoyed themselves and learnt some valuable self-defence skills.

In Term 1, the Year 7 / 8 team inquired into the concepts of Community and Empowerment, and how these concepts contribute to people's Mana.

We first had to understand what a community was in different contexts and understand how we contribute to and impact a community. This taught us a lot about how we can help others around us and develop our Mana as both individuals, and as a group.

We then learned about ways in which people are empowered to make change, exploring how we could be empowered learners also.

Our challenge was to find out about people who have displayed to make change for a particular community. Students researched their chosen person and presented their findings on a website. It was great to learn about others, in order to empower ourselves too. We found out that there is a lot of Mana in the work people do around the world and locally.



Community Impacts

Through her discovery of radium, Marie had a huge impact on the Cancer Community. The Marie Curie Cancer Care Foundation was started on February the 4th in 1948 to support and care for people with terminal illnesses and their families. According to history, Marie was the first woman to win on her own merit. This meant that she had an impact on women - encouraging women to succeed on their own account.

Marie has set many records for Nobel Prizes, as she was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize, she was the first person and only woman to win a Nobel Prize twice, she was also the first person and only woman to win a Nobel Prize in two different scientific fields, and with her husband Pierre, she was the first married couple to win a Nobel Prize. His main inspiration was to see people of all abilities represented in sport, as he hadn't seen this growing up himself. This motivated him to give it a go. He wanted to do things like everyone else, and not be restricted to what other people thought he could or couldn't do.














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
