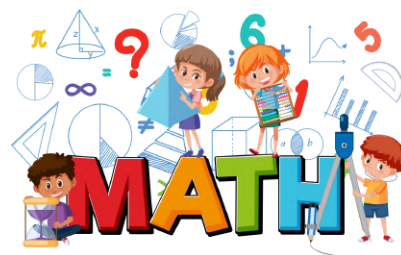
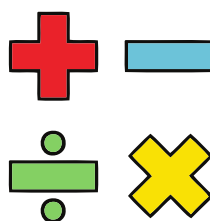
### WHITTAKERS CHOCOLATE FUNDRAISER

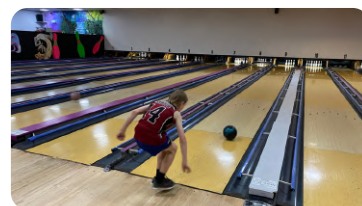
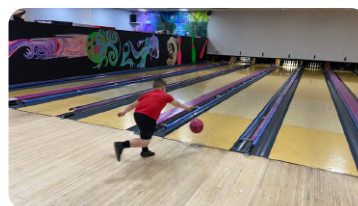

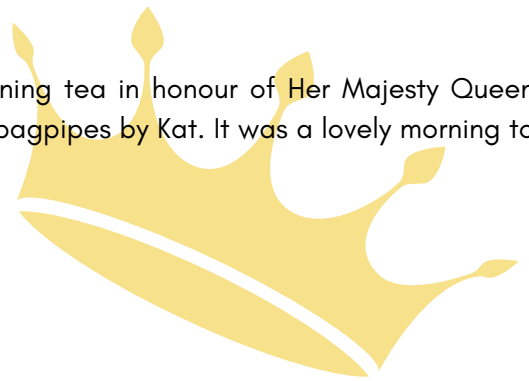

## Room 4 ~ Maunga Moment ~

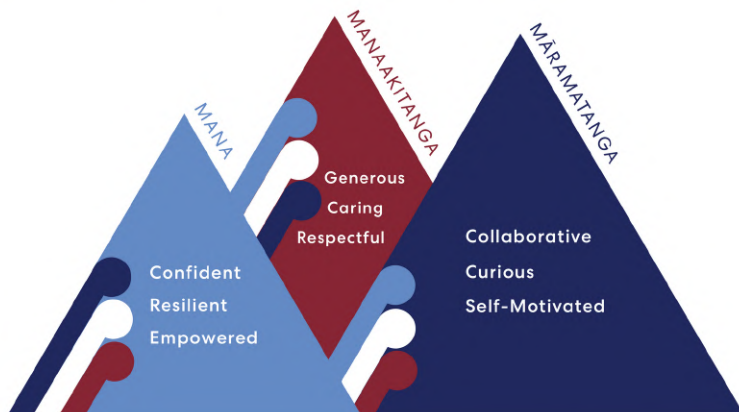
Here is our Manaakitanga Tree showing how we can be generous, caring and respectful

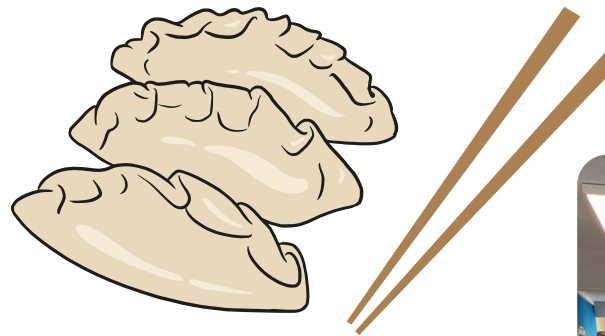
