There were 26,322 entries to the QCEC from every Commonwealth region, and Sawooly was the Senior Winner! Sawooly traveled to England to be presented with the award by the Queen Consort Camilla. An absolutely amazing achievement for Sawooly!

Sawooly also won the International Baccalaureate Proxime Accessit at the Rangitoto College end of year Prize Giving. Congratulations Sawooly for such wonderful achievements!


Come along and enjoy our annual Family Fun Night taking place next Friday night from 5pm - 8pm! The students have been busy baking things and preparing




Room 23 ~ Maunga Moment ~
