The non-competitive events at school included frisbee throw, gumboot throwing, hurdles, high jump, long jump and running races.

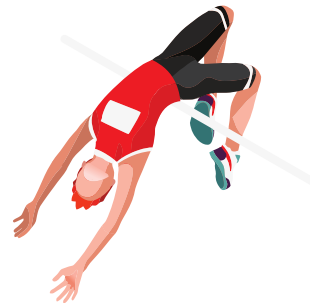
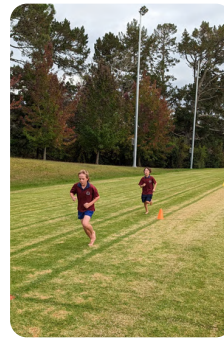
Well done to all the children at both days for giving it their all and encouraging one another.

Thank you to all the parent helpers for assisting with time keeping, recording and organising at Moire Park - we greatly appreciate your support.

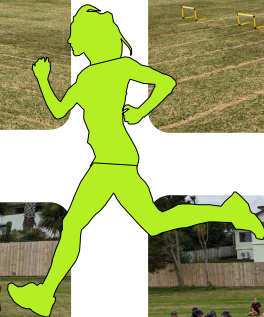

Room 13 students showed Manaakitanga by being respectful to all cultures. They participated in all the activities that were planned for gaining Cultural experience. This was part of the immersion process in the Inquiry Unit of 'This is Us', with the underlying concept of Identity and community. When in Room 11 the students looked at Japanese art of origami making birds. In Room 12 they experienced Aboriginal dot Art Painting of native Australian Animals. In Room 13, the students learnt about the Indian alphabet and script, writing and decorating their names written in Hindi. In Room 14, the students had a wonderful time learning how to use the rakau sticks and the poi from the Māori culture. In Room 16, the students made Chinese lanterns and in Room 17 they worked collaboratively, showing maramatanga, to weave paper mats.
