NZ ORIENTEERING NATIONALS

During the July School holidays the New Zealand Secondary Schools Orienteering Championships were held in Blenheim (13th July-15th July). Emma Whitehead represented Marina View School at the three events in the Year 7/8 Division; Long course, short course (sprint), and the team relay. It was a wonderful experience for her and she represented her school with enthusiasm and pride. Emma achieved 5th place in the Long course event which was 3.5km long and extremely hilly, and 17th in the 2km sprint course around the Blenheim CBD. As Emma was the only student representing Marina View School, she was entered into a composite team for the relay event located in the Wither Hills Mountain Bike Park. Her team consisted of a student from Christchurch and another student from Auckland and they came in 4th place. A huge thank you to the Coaches of Mount Albert Grammar School's Orienteering team (Neil McGowan and Callum Wishart) who welcomed Emma into their camp and made her feel part of their team. Emma benefited greatly from their briefings, de-briefings and map / route teachings.

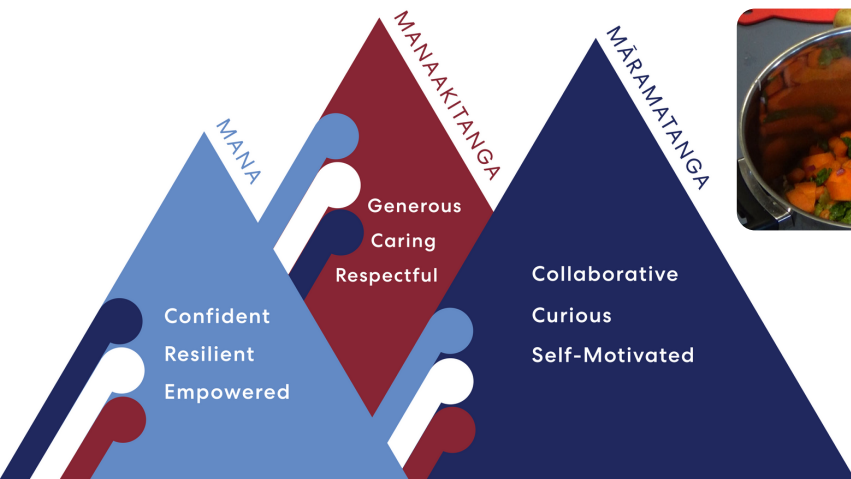

Throughout our first two weeks of Term 3 students have been noticing, encouraging, and displaying the dispositions of Mana, Manaakitanga, and Maramatanga as we connect and learn together. We have been adding to our kete of knowledge finding out more about Matariki and stories of the past. Reading "Nanny Mihi's Garden" by Melanie Drewery helped us learn new phrases, the seasons, and the names of nga hua whenua (vegetables). We know Matariki is a time to spend time with family, remember those who have passed on, set new goals, tell stories, think about our land and how to look after it, and feast together. We collaborated, working together to make Matariki soup. Many children brought vegetables from home. We visited our own school garden to identify hua whenua in our language we speak at home, Te Reo Maori and English. We harvested some additional items. Working together we carefully prepared our vegies and were finally able to share our feast together before going home.

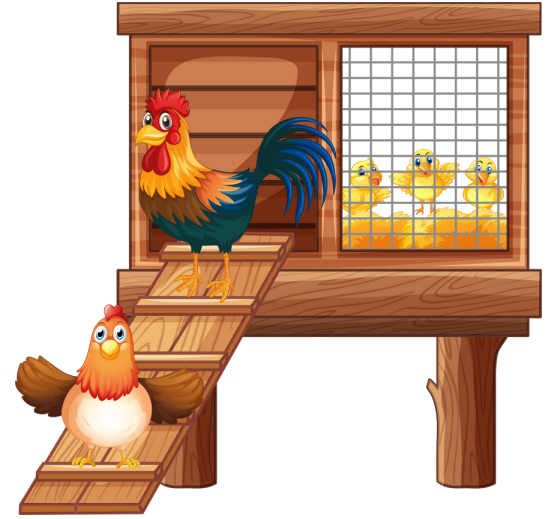


TECHNOLOGY
