TECH INQUIRY

As part of their inquiry this term, the Intermediates are looking at herbal medicines and their uses and benefits. They looked at two remedies and then made them with Mr Gover. The first one was Kawakawa Salve, which is a topical ointment used for cuts scratches bumps and bruises This is part of the Māori Rongoā - Māori herbal medicine. They cut the kawakawa up and put it in warm oil for 8 hours, then sieved it and grated in beeswax into the infused oil to set it, then put it in small containers to take home.









COMFREY POULTICE: This remedy was made by the ancient Romans and Greeks. It is used for bone breaks, strains, sprains and bruising, and often called 'bone knit'. We grow comfrey in the school garden so we took some and chopped it into a bowl with some water. We used a blender to turn it into a paste, then put it in a plastic bag and froze it. When you have an injury, take it out of the plastic bag, wrap it in a paper towel and place on the affected area. Do this 3-4 times a day for a few days. This is a very ancient and proven herbal medicine and it works.



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TAHI RUA EASTER HUNT

Room Tahi Rua had great fun on their Easter Hunt last Thursday. The children carefully followed the clues that Mrs Lydiard and Miss Parkinson had placed around the school until they finally found the Easter treasure!

The children had some help from the Year 7 & 8 students in Room 23, making Easter crafts and enjoying some buddy reading together, demonstrating our school values of Manaakitanga.




