On Friday 7th June our Year 7/8 Table Tennis Team competed in the North West Zone Championship hosted by Hobsonville Point School.


All players were competitive, achieving some very good results. Our certificate winners were:






















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#### KIA KAHA PROGRAMME

Currently, our students are participating in the NZ Police Kia Kaha programme at school, with support from our local Community Constable Sarah Jones. Kia Kaha consists of a comprehensive range of antibullying resources to help children and young people learn and apply a range of safe practices that they can use to build and maintain successful relationships throughout their lives. Through Kia Kaha students develop strategies for respectful relationships where bullying behaviours are not tolerated.
