Room 21 created recipes using our Maunga Dispositions as ingredients. We did this for instructional writing.

Kingsley's Maunga Friendship Recipe

Disposition Ingredients:

2 cups of empowerment	2 teaspoons of self-motivation
1 cup of resilience	1 cup of Curiosity
1 cup of confidence	1 cup of Collaborativeness
1 cup of respect	1 teaspoon of humour
1 cup of caring	1 sprinkle of kindness
1 cup of generosity	1 cup of understanding

Step 1. Mix 2 cups of empowerment, 1 cup of confidence and 1 cup of resilience in a bowl for 1 minute. You will now have confidence to go up to that person to start a friendship.

Step 2. Next - by combining 1 cup of generosity, 1 cup of respect and 1 cup of caring into the same bowl, this will form part of respecting each other.

Step 3. Put 1 teaspoon humour and 2 teaspoons of self-motivation together in a bowl. These ingredients will make you really funny

Step 4. Use a sprinkle of kindness and 1 cup understanding in a bowl. This will make you really kind.

Step 5. Finally, add 1 cup of curiosity and 1 cup of collaborativeness to all of the ingredients. You can cook or bake this however you like.

Mana and the Zones of Regulation

In Room 7 we have been learning about the four Zones of Regulation. We can sort all of the emotions we feel into the Zones and can help regulate our response by knowing what to do to help ourselves. We are learning to feel confident and empowered, and be resilient, just like our favourite storybook character, Gerald the Giraffe from 'Giraffe's Can't Dance' by Giles Andreae.

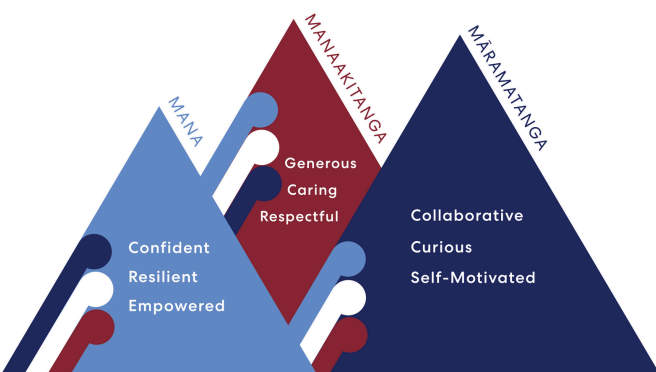

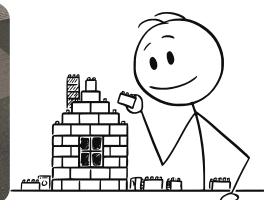
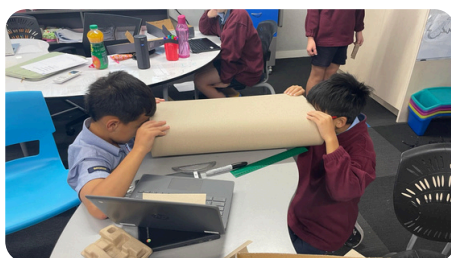
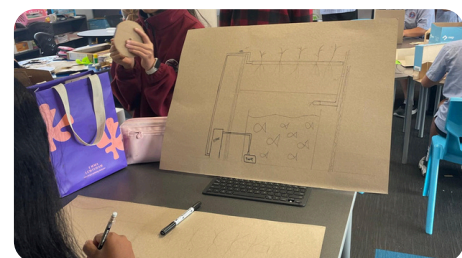
LIBRARY DONATION
