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TREES FOR SURVIVAL

On Thursday the 22nd of August, 16 students from Room 25 and 3 adults went and planted small native trees at a farm in South Head. The Trees for Survival programme teaches students, "Environmental education in action - we're restoring our environment through the growing and planting of native trees! Together we're growing and planting native trees in areas they're needed the most - protecting streams, wetlands and erosion-prone land." The landowner this year where the trees were planted was Mr and Mrs Gover's farm.

In Term 4, 2023 we planted native seedlings and over the year, they grew. You can see them in the Compost area in the garden area. Over the week, Mrs Gover transported them to the farm ready for us to plant. We dug and learnt how to make perfect squares to lift up to create space for the trees to grow. Collectively as a class we planted 560 trees. We were all exhausted and proud of our efforts. Mr Gover cooked us all sausages and we had "pigs in blankets" he called them for lunch.

Then we packed up all the empty crates and black seedling packets to bring back to school to plant more for 2025. I wonder which farm we will go to next?
