
YEAR 7/8 TOUCH ZONES

IMPORTANT ROAD SAFETY MESSAGE

This morning we had an Auckland Community Transport representative come out to our school to take part of our Road Patrol group for a 'Speed Radar' activation exercise, as part of an effort to try and keep our school community safe around the roads.

The students then came back to calculate the average speed, percentage of speeders, etc to build a picture of how safe our roads are around the school. The data showed that we still have a high number of drivers going above the speed limit.

As part of an ongoing safety programme, Auckland Community Transport and AT parking enforcement will continue to support our school so that our students are safe coming to, and leaving, each day. They will be checking that driving speed is at the designated 40kph during the hours of 8.15am - 9.00am and 2:55pm - 3:15pm, and that parking is within the legal parameters (not parking over driveways, curbs or on yellow lines) and they will be giving out tickets to driver's breaching the law.

We would like to thank those who continue to drive with caution at pick up and drop off times around our school. Safety of our students and families is paramount.


Room 17 ~ Maunga Moment ~
