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
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SPORTS YEAR 7/8 CRICKET FIELD DAY

Many thanks to Mrs Hui and Mrs Li for managing the team while I worked poolside, and other parents who transported and supported our team on the day.


To those swimmers who trialed for our swimming team and didn't get selected this time, keep on working hard in preparation for 2026.

Having qualities and values to help you 'be the best version of you' are very important in Room 19. It is really important to us to identify when we see people using the dispositions that make our school community so special. In Room 19, we are learning the importance of being a self-motivated and empowered learner who is curious about the world around them and can work positively with others. We often refer to 'the golden rule'; treat others the way you want to be treated. This means we show manaakitanga at every opportunity; we are kind, caring, and generous with our time (to help and support others) and we take care of our environment. This week our class visited the Auckland Museum with Rooms 20 and 21. The children were so excited about this trip and were particularly engaged in the scavenger hunt that had been organsied to help explore the Museum and its wonderful exhibits. It was pleasing to see the energy and enthusiasm the children showed as they visited all the galleries. Highlights included the World War I and World War II exhibits, Weird and Wonderful (working collaboratively together to study insects with powerful microscopes), and of course, the Volcanoes section with 'the earthquake house'. There was so much to see and do at the Museum, so if you have a chance to take your family there, it is a fabulous day out - I'm sure we only 'touched the surface'.

In Room 7 we have been learning about what each of the Maunga mean and defining them in our own words. We have an understanding that Mana is about
