ANZAC DAY PARADE

YEAR 1 & 2 STEPPING OUT PROGRAMME

During Week 1 and 2, our Year 1 & 2 students participated in the 'Stepping Out' programme, which focuses on teaching road safety to young children. Stepping Out is facilitated by our Local Constable Sarah Jones. The children are spoken to about road safety, then shown how to use the pedestrian crossing safely and awareness around footpaths and driveways. The children are also spoken to about car safety (seatbelts/booster seats) and then practise sitting in the back seat of the Police car doing up the seatbelt whilst sitting in the booster seat.



YEAR 7 & 8 TECH

Part of "tech" this term for the Year 7-8 is a series of lessons with Mr Gover on different aspects of "SPACE". The students here are learning about growing plants in space so are using growing medium like perlite and vermiculite to grow their plants under a UV light. This week they planted bean seeds. They also are designing and making a rocket and trying out the design using the rocket launcher - this is a prototype so its only the first one of many rocket designs.



The students are using the Oculus 3D headsets to do some astronaut training on the International Space Station - now this is cool fun! Some of the students are using their creative design skills to design and make a space colony on the moon or a space station floating in space. They are using the Tinkercad programme as they can design their "colony" in real time 3D.

PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Teachers' Institute's (TTI) Post Graduate Diploma in Teaching (Primary, School-based) is a one-year, full-time programme leading to New Zealand teacher registration. It features a unique mode of delivery, with all trainees based in a home school for the year where they will be fully engaged in all aspects of school life.

Trainees will be partnered with a mentor teacher or teachers and as the year progresses, will gradually take on more responsibility for their mentor's class.

The in-school experience will be complemented by a series of 2-3 day weekly workshops, where trainees from across the TTI network will come together to build their knowledge of effective teaching practice.

All trainees will complete 40 days of "away practicum" to experience working and teaching in other schools. This assists in developing professional relationships with other educators and prospective employers.

There will be online course material for each of the courses. These materials will be unpacked during in-person workshops.

During the workshops, trainees will be introduced to particular teaching practices and tasks. They also provide an opportunity for these to be practised in a controlled and supportive environment, prior to being implemented in the classroom.

Assessments for the courses will be spaced throughout the year and are aligned with the different tasks that trainees will be doing in their schools.

ANNUAL & WEEKLY SCHEDULE

The programme runs from January through to December, following the shape of the school year. During school terms, students will be engaged in either their in-school experience or in-person workshops.

Teacher trainees must:

- Hold a Bachelor's degree at level 7 on the New Zealand Qualification Framework (NZQF), or a recognised equivalent
- Demonstrate competence in one of the official languages of the national curriculum - English or Te Reo Māori


