MVS LEADERS TRIP TO ASB HEAD QUARTERS Thursday 14th June 2018





On the 14th of June, the MVS Leaders went ASB Head Offices in Wynyard Quarter to learn about its future in robotic software. Kyle Brient (Mrs Buckley's sister) showed us around the building and talked to us about their robots, Josie and Campbell, with her other colleagues.


Josie has been made to be ASB's future virtual desk clerk and assistant. She can speak and respond to questions, but she cannot yet learn about the world. Campbell was made to do paperwork that would usually take humans hours to do so we can do tasks that need our attention more than copying and pasting documents. ASB continue to develop Campbell's software and when he is able to do more it is obvious that he will be very popular around the world.

Kylie took us to The Grid, another building for select ASB staff to work in, and explained to us Hackfest, where staff submit their innovations/ideas and if selected are chosen to develop their idea into reality. We spoke to four colleagues in The Grid about their new app called 'The Giving Tree'. They told us it was an app they made so people could save up money for the future.
