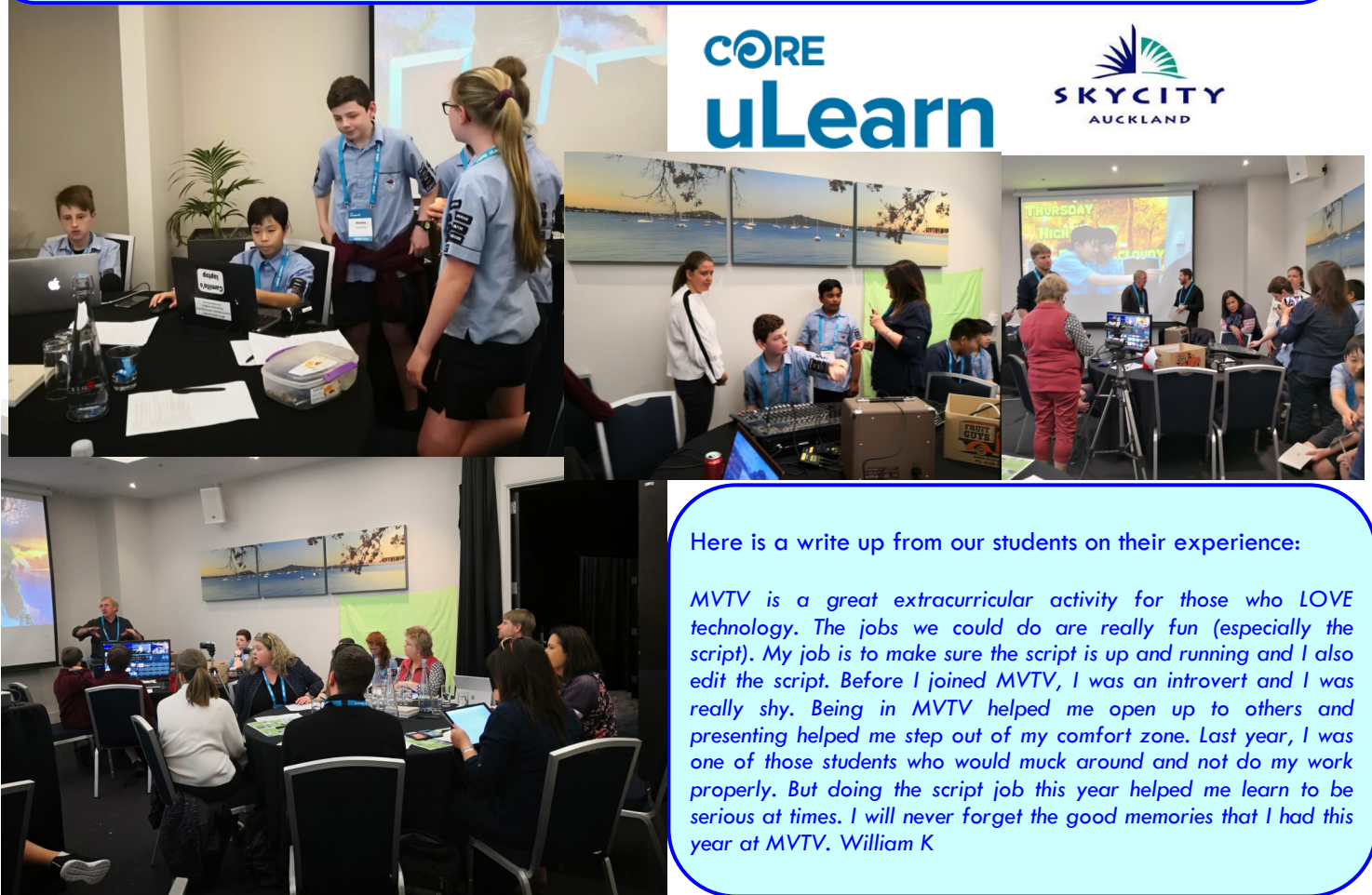
Just so you know that things can't end happily, two ferocious parents walk in, furious at being awakened at 6.30a.m. on a Sunday morning.
