# SPORTS SUCCESS WORLD STARS OF JUNIOR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

The World Stars of Junior Golf Championship has become one of the premier Junior Golf Championships in the world. Throughout the year there are four season tours that you can participate in. This championship has attracted over 2,000 players from over 50 countries. This year I played in the New Zealand Autumn Tour, which took place over 6 weeks. In each tour you play a total of six rounds of 18 holes.

I played with some very talented golfers from around the region, keeping the competition close at all times. Out of the 6 rounds I managed to get 1st two times, 2nd two times, 3rd one time and 4th one time. The six weeks were coming to an end, and I had to come either first or second in the last tournament to qualify for the Las Vegas Open and the California International.

After trading positions on the leader board with the other golfers, it all came down to the last hole. All the other noises quickly faded, sweat dripping down my face on a cold winter's day and my heart beating out of my chest, as I had an eight foot downhill putt awaiting for me. My dad said, "You have to make this putt to qualify to play in the U.S" which echoed in my head.

Suddenly, it felt like the air had left the golf course, as I heard the rattling noise of the ball in the hole. I had done it! Whilst feeling ecstatic, I felt bad that my other playing partners had missed out on a trip of a lifetime.


I am very humbled and delighted to have been given this opportunity by North Shore Golf Club.

## YEAR 3 INQUIRY - MOON PHASES

Room 32 has been working on Moon Phases, one of the inquiry questions from our class was about the changing shapes of Moon. Through this activity we learnt that the Moon does not change its shape at any time. The surface of the Moon is like a mirror that reflects the light of the sun. When the Moon revolves around the Earth, different parts of the Moon get sunlight all through the month. We can only see the part that is lit but the rest of the Moon is very much there! Room 32 learnt the names of all the phases of the moon and to remind us of the difference between all the Moon phases we used oreo cookies in place of the Moon. In this activity students could only eat that part of the cookie moon which was not reflecting the sunlight. As you can see from the pictures, the New Moon Phase has no cookie on it because New Moon night is No Moon night as no part of the Moon is reflecting sunlight. On the other hand, they could not eat any part of the Full Moon cookie because all of the Moon is reflecting the sun's light in that phase. It was a fun activity and I know that we will remember the Moon phases for a long time.
