
















# TECHNOLOGY IMAGINTEURS AND IMAGINARIOS

Room 25 has been learning about the Marina View School Maunga's. We discussed ways that we can see us using the three attributes to highlight each Maunga. These attributes are Mana, Manaakitanga and Maramatanga. We went to Room 8 and showed Manaakitanga to them by sharing our knowledge of Maori games and sharing stories with them. After that we decided to create role plays to show the three attributes using a Pixton comic. Here are a few examples of our comics.

Mana is about feeling confident and proud with your learning, and being happy about what you have accomplished.



Maramatanga is about being understanding and caring for the people around you and helping out the best you can.



Manaakitanga is about being generous and caring about your surroundings without being told. Its about showing respect to others and helping them out.
