SICKNESS

We are currently experiencing a number of children with tummy bugs at school. 

In the last week of Term 2, Room 25 took part in a hands-on Cycle Safety workshop run by the fantastic team from North Harbour Sports. It was a great opportunity for us to build our confidence, learn new skills, and put our class focus on Mana into action — showing resilience, respect, and responsibility in a real-world setting.

The session kicked off with students being grouped based on their biking confidence – from those just learning to ride, to moderately confident riders, all the way to those with high levels of experience. Every student had the chance to develop at their own pace and feel supported.

We learned so much about helmet safety – including how to choose a helmet that meets official safety standards and how to wear it correctly for full protection. We also revisited the ABC check for bikes (Air, Brakes, Chain) to ensure our bikes are roadworthy before every ride.

Road rules, hand signals, and safe riding practices were all covered in a hands-on and fun way, with a strong emphasis on being responsible and confident riders.

It was a brilliant session that not only equipped us with vital safety skills but also helped us grow in confidence and independence. A big thank you to the North Harbour Sports team for helping us ride safe and with mana!

Here's what some of us had to say about the experience:


Tiya: I was partially confident bike riding, now I am more confident and will probably ride more in the future. The instructors were also really kind and helped you, when you made mistakes.

Vanessa: I already knew how to ride a bike, but after the session, I felt even more confident. The instructors were really kind and supportive, and the session was really fun!

Prasha - I'm usually pretty good at most things, so at first I felt frustrated not knowing how to ride a bike well. But the instructors were really kind and made me feel comfortable, which helped me stay calm and keep trying. Now I can actually ride a bike!

Mrs Dorset: I'm really proud of Room 25 for showing true Mana through their resilience during the bike safety sessions. They faced challenges with determination, supported each other but most

importantly they had fun!


