TREES FOR SURVIVAL

Late last year, our senior students helped re-pot and care for over 850 native seedlings — starting from just 5cm tall! Thanks to their ongoing efforts, many of these seedlings grew to over 50cm and are thriving. On Monday 4th of August, 40 students from Year 5 & 6 went and planted these small native trees at a farm in Waimauku and help regenerate the native forest in the area

We ended up planting 809 trees throughout the day. Everyone enjoyed the hands-on conservation experience. It was a fantastic opportunity for students to learn more about environmental stewardship, conservation, and the positive impact we can have on our ecosystems.

We will plant the next lot of seedlings in September ready for next year. A big thank you to Mrs Taljaard and the Trees for Survival students for helping make the tree planting day a success.
