The Board has carefully considered the availability of teaching staff, and unfortunately decided that we can't provide the normal teaching services during the strike. **The school will need to close for the day.** We fully appreciate that this is difficult for parents juggling work and other commitments, but appreciate the support of our community for our teachers. 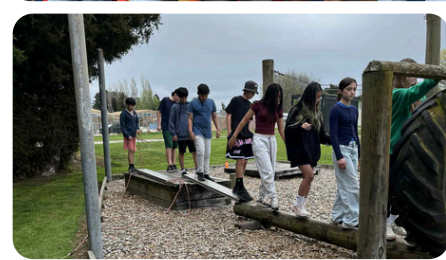
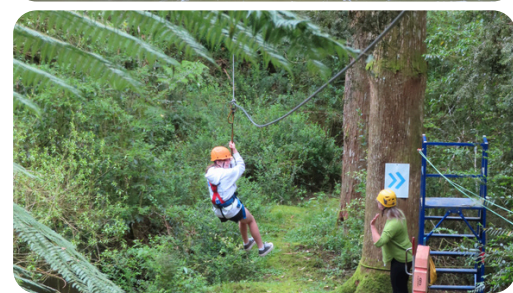
The rain came back for the afternoon so we headed to Mini Golf for some fun before heading to Cobb 'n Co for dinner.

After dinner, we went to Redwood Forest to experience the Redwood Nightlights Treetops Walk - a spectacular show of lights on display up amongst the large Redwood Trees.

On the Friday, we enjoyed a stroll along the lakefront before heading to Whakarewarewa Living Village. We were shown around the village by one of the local guides, who continues a family long tradition of guiding. Since the early 1800's, they have been hosting and welcoming guests into their homes and backyards. She shared insights into Māori culture, as well as demonstrating the utilisation of the natural geothermal wonders for cooking, bathing and heating. We were lucky to see the Geyser's erupting in the distance, and finished the tour with a delicious hangi lunch and cultural performance.

Our Leaders represented Marina View School with pride and excellence which was noticed by a number of people where we were present. We hope the Leaders learned some valuable information about the history of this part of New Zealand.
